What it Means to be Evangelical

We are a people with a special habit, or discipline, of the faith. We make disciples of Christ among the nations by preaching the gospel and sharing our faith personally with others. Like the Gerasene demoniac, we long to tell others how much the Lord has done for us, and how He has had mercy on us (Mark 5:19). Everything we do is influenced by our desire to tell others the story of Jesus and to show them that in His name they may receive forgiveness of sins. That is what it means to be “evangelical.” This emphasis upon the work of evangelism and discipleship is the badge of evangelical Christianity. The Christian man or woman who things evangelically confesses that God’s offer of salvation to the world is the truth that lies at the heart of the Bible. God sent Jesus to give the world a savior (John 3:17). In the same way, God sends us to share this Good News with others. We ask our neighbors, our friends, our family members, and perfect strangers, “Are you saved?” We preach the Good News, announcing what God has done for us sinners through His Son and what He requires of us for our salvation according to the Scriptures.

The gospel is our norm, in which our rule of faith is grounded. We embrace the first ecumenical council held in Jerusalem at which the apostle Peter bore witness that God would have all peoples “hear the word of the gospel and believe” (Acts 15:7 NASB).
